## WHAT ARE ROMANCE SCAMS?

The scam begins with fraudsters creating fake profiles on social networking or online dating websites. They then show interest in developing a "serious" relationship with you. They may claim to be from Québec and traveling or working as consultants abroad.

They toy with your feelings by canceling in-person meetings under various pretexts: failure to obtain a visa, illness or loss of employment. Next, they try to extract money from you by getting you to make transfers, share prepaid card codes, send cheques by mail, etc.

They are quite crafty and, if they end up disappointing you, will do anything to regain your trust and extract money from you again.

## **ARE YOU RELUCTANT TO TALK ABOUT IT?**



Is your partner making you feel less alone?



Do you love them and feel loved in return?



Have you gone into debt for them?



Are you ashamed and afraid to tell your loved ones about the situation?

Your hesitation is normal. However, you may be the victim of a romance scam.

#### DO NOT HESITATE TO TALK ABOUT IT.

Talking about it could also help identify other victims: in many cases, online partners use their tactics on several victims at a time.
