## MISSION

The EMIPIC's mission is to foster greater complementarity of the services provided to Indigenous and non-Indigenous people in vulnerable situations, particularly in relation to homelessness, addiction, social exclusion, and mental health. These teams also aim to facilitate access to tailored, personalized services.

## COMPLEMENTARY EXPERTISE

An EMIPIC is a multidisciplinary team made up of individuals from the fields of policing, health care, and social services. It works in partnership and cooperation with community and government organizations, as well as with Indigenous friendship centres.

## CUSTOMIZED APPROACH

The team's interventions are based on a relationship of helping, listening and prevention. They encourage the use of alternatives to court action.

An EMIPIC builds trust relationships, takes the time needed to intervene, and does follow-up with people in vulnerable situations. It works in a complementary way with front-line police officers.



## TAILORED SERVICES

The members of an EMIPIC work directly with people in vulnerable situations to ensure that they are quickly referred to the various aid resources tailored to their needs.

To achieve this objective, these teams rely on the invaluable support of many partner organizations.

## STRENGTHENED CULTURAL SAFETY

Cultural safety is a set of actions, practices, and expertise that enable a person to feel safe as well as free from prejudice and discrimination during an intervention or a service provided. The EMIPIC approach is promoted among partners and collaborators.
